Community Alert: AVP Mourns the Death of Amanda Gonzalez-Andujar

AVP is saddened and outraged by the death of Amanda Gonzalez-Andujar, who was found in her apartment on Tuesday, March 31 in Glendale, Queens. Her death has been ruled a homicide and there were signs of struggle in the apartment. An investigation is currently underway by the NYPD.

Today, AVP and other community-based organizations that work in Queens will be meeting at Queens Pride House on Friday night to organize and start flyering for community safety.
