Join AVP in observing Transgender Day of Remembrance (TDoR)

On Monday, August 1, Camila Guzman was found murdered in an apartment on East 110th Street in Harlem. On August 11, AVP, along with Camila's family, friends and community allies gathered in East Harlem to honor her memory. Camila's tragic death demonstrates the prevalence of violence against transgender people in this country. According to the 2010 Report on Hate Violence released by the National Coalition of Anti-Violence Programs, transgender women are disproportionately impacted by murder, accounting for 44 percent of gay and transgender murder victims in 2010.

Transgender Day of Remembrance is a day to reflect on the lives of transgender and gender non-conforming people we have lost to violence while recommitting ourselves to work every day to end this violence. *"Camila was a great friend and we will always remember her, on this day and every day. This is a very important day to remember our sisters who have passed on, and we will always have her in our hearts and minds. Thank you to AVP for supporting us through our hard times"* said Ruby Teresa Chavez, a friend of Camila Guzman.
