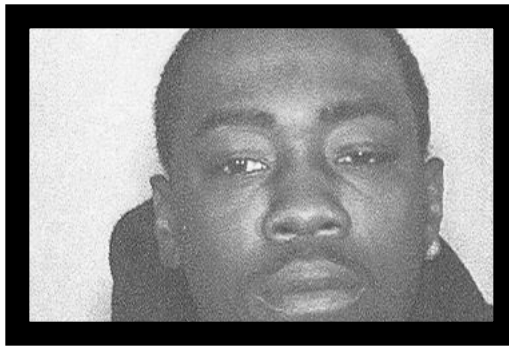


You Can Help Solve This Case

On the evening of Wednesday, June 8, Dwan Prince was savagely beaten outside his apartment building on East 94th Street near King's highway in Brownsville by three men who used anti-gay epithets while assaulting him..

He has been in intensive care at Brookdale hospital since the attack, but doctors say Prince is improving.

The NYPD has identified Steven Pomie (pictured) as part of the group allegedly responsible for the assault on Prince.
